


The UK Government has introduced a requirement for voters to show photo ID when voting at a polling station at some elections.

Landmark smashed and brass plate stolen from beauty spot



A landmark toposcope which has been in situ for almost 30 years at a Staffordshire beauty spot has been smashed and its large brass plate stolen.

The toposcope at Baggeridge Country Park is believed to have been targeted by thieves overnight on Friday (April 21st), with the extensive damage having been discovered by park rangers on Saturday morning.

The brass plate - measuring around 3ft in diameter - and the toposcope on which it sat has been the site of a range of events over the years, most recently when a beacon was lit last summer to mark the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

The toposcope, which has been at Baggeridge since 1994, is also a key location for the thousands of people who visit the park each year for its range of walking routes and scenic views.

The plate bears carvings resembling a compass, showing the distance from the toposcope to a range of nearby locations.

South Staffordshire Council, which runs Baggeridge Country Park, is urging anyone who may come across the plate or anyone who may have witnessed the vandalism and theft to contact Staffordshire Police on 101, quoting incident number 44026423.

Staffordshire Police: 'Let's Talk Stalking'

Staffordshire Police is running a campaign to raise awareness of what stalking is and the key behaviours a stalker may display. It also aims to raise awareness of how people can keep themselves safe both in person and online.

Stalking is defined as 'a pattern of fixated and obsessive behaviour which is repeated, persistent, intrusive and causes fear of violence or engenders alarm and distress in the victim.'



Most stalking victims know their stalker, for example, they could be an ex-partner, family member or a work colleague. Regardless of the relationship between the victim and the stalker, this behaviour is not acceptable.

We want people to recognise the FOUR behaviours highlighted in our video above that are warning signs that someone is stalking you:

Fixated - being followed on your daily routine, spied on, or being watched by someone loitering around your work or home.

Obsession - being monitored on or offline, cyberstalking, the ordering and cancelling of items on your behalf.

Unwanted attention - gifts being sent or left for you; unwanted messages, letters or phone calls. Even damage or graffiti being caused to your property.

Repeated behaviour - this can be any nuisance or threatening behaviour, being approached, accosted or bullied repeatedly.

SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR 2022/2023

The Great Wyrley Senior Citizens Centre is being used 7 days a week now by local groups.

The original group of Senior Citizens are still using the Centre on a Monday and now have new members which has kept the group continuing. Great Wyrley Tap Class use the Centre on a Monday morning. Wyrley Indoor Sports use the Centre on a Tuesday afternoon, Great Wyrley Townswomen use the Centre once a month on a Tuesday Evening and hold a Book Club every few weeks. A Craft and Card Class use it on a Wednesday morning and afternoon. Thursdays is still the meeting day for Great Wyrley History Society and an Art Class on the afternoon. Tai Chi Classes are held on a Friday morning. Saturday and Sunday mornings private Dance Lessons are held. A Church Group use the Centre fortnightly on a Saturday evening and a Pre-School Play and Learn group use once a fortnight on a Tuesday morning. The Centre is also available to hire for private parties, committee meetings etc.

More Trustees are always required to help keep the Centre running. The Trustees wish to thank Great Wyrley Parish Council for their financial support to the Centre.

Report from Great Wyrley Townswomen's Guild (May 2023)

This has worked well, providing variety as well as some stability with the help of a hard-working committee of ten.

Entertainment throughout the year has been very much enjoyed with the story of the *Gingham Girls* of the 1960's in April, and then the more serious but very informative talk on the History of Stafford Gaol. We celebrated the Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth II with a fantastic tea party at which Tim Rooney sang while we danced. In July we had a very interesting talk on Mary Quant, whereas in August, Cherie, from Wyrley Flowers, expertly demonstrated flower arranging. Then Nigel Wiggin talked about Old Hall Stainless Steel and the following month we found out more about Morcombe and Wise. In November we were informed about Christmas traditions associated with Charles Dickens while at Christmas *Mr Popple* entertained us with magic and jokes. In January Peter Holmes kindly provided a quiz and members, June Brown and Bette Webb, talked about their careers working with babies and children. For International Women's Day, two local ladies with interesting careers, Kath Perry and Diana Gunn, told us of their successful lives and we have just celebrated the Coronation with a party and the *Lavender Girls* entertaining.

We have also had trips to theatre shows, for example, *Chorus Line* at the Prince of Wales and *Ladies'* Day at the New Vic at Newcastle under Lyme, whereas at Christmas a visit to the *Snow Queen* was arranged. Treasurers End of Year Statement

The previous treasurer resigned at the end of 2022 and new financial controls were introduced with a view to conforming to the Charity Commission requirements.

The "Lighter Touch" audit regulations state that accounts which end a financial year in deficit do not have to be audited and as this was a year for re-establishing our services we have ended with a loss of £577 (rounded). Therefore the accounts do not need to be audited saving around £250.00 to £300. With a view to increasing efficiency we now have access to online banking and are paying a number of transactions electronically. We have also set up an Amazon Business Account, with a view to reducing costs.

We are hoping to convince the County Council to renew the property lease which, at the moment, ends in October. With that in mind we are trying to increase the hours of opening to extend our services to include offering our trips to the residents of Oak House.
